STAFF TRAINING

All of our support staff, counselors, expedition leaders, and crew complete an intense two-week orientation and training session. Topics covered include safety on and off-property; creating a positive and healthy cabin community; and skills for guiding our residential and adventure programs.

Staff are required to have CPR and first aid training. In addition, many staff are certified lifeguards and have their Wilderness First Aid and Wilderness First Responder certifications.

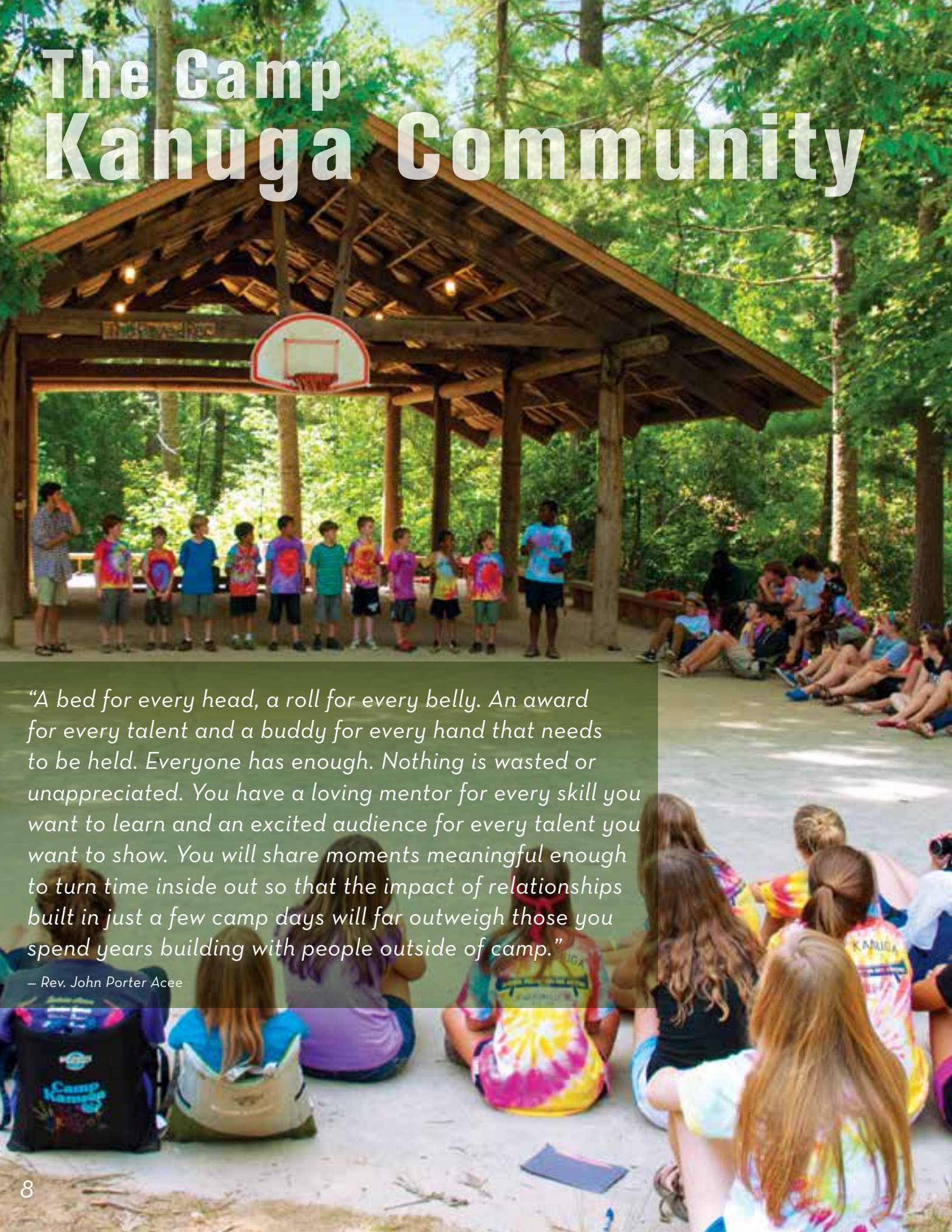
- We can meet any dietary needs. Our camp is a nut-free campus with gluten-free and vegetarian options available by request in the dining hall and on campouts.
- Each cabin has two counselors per cabin who have current certifications in CPR and first aid.
- Our camp nurse and her support staff are all registered nurses. While camp is in session, they are on-site and available 24/7 with a doctor on call. They can do everything from handing out hugs and band-aids to administering medication.

AGES 8-15 • DURATION: 9 & 13 DAYS

Amid mountain vistas, cool streams and towering pines, campers enjoy a season of friendship and growth. We cultivate teamwork, friendship, determination, self-reliance, positive self-esteem, faith, and spirituality.

Camp Kanuga is one of the nation's longest running programs accredited by the American Camp Association. In fact, we exceed the industry standards for camp program quality, youth development, education, and safety. Since 1931, Camp Kanuga campers have been forming lifelong friendships, experiencing new adventures, and exploring their faith in our welcoming Christian community. Our residential camp experience is for boys and girls who join us in a spectacular mountain setting.

Starter Camp

AGES 7-9 • DURATION: 4 DAYS

This three-night session is designed to expose campers to new activities in a safe and fun way, with minor differences from our Traditional Camp:

- 4-day, 3-night session
- cabin groups always stay together
- planned schedule includes age-appropriate activities with campers their own age
- day hikes but no overnight hikes with full backpacks
- challenge course and climbing wall are used, but not the high elements course
- cabins house 10 - 12 campers with 2 counselors

Check in and check out at the church each day. Families can drop off the younger kids at day camp and the older kids at adventure day camp. Drop off & pick up locations and times are the same. The whole family is covered. Adventure Day Camps go offsite with Camp Kanuga staff leading them on a new adventure activity each day. Camp Kanuga provides the transportation. Adventure Day Campers may experience biking, swimming, hiking, water park day, kayaking, canoeing, mountain biking, stand up paddle boarding, rock climbing, skim boarding, boogie boarding, and an adventure day at Camp Kanuga. The adventure activities vary depending on the church location.

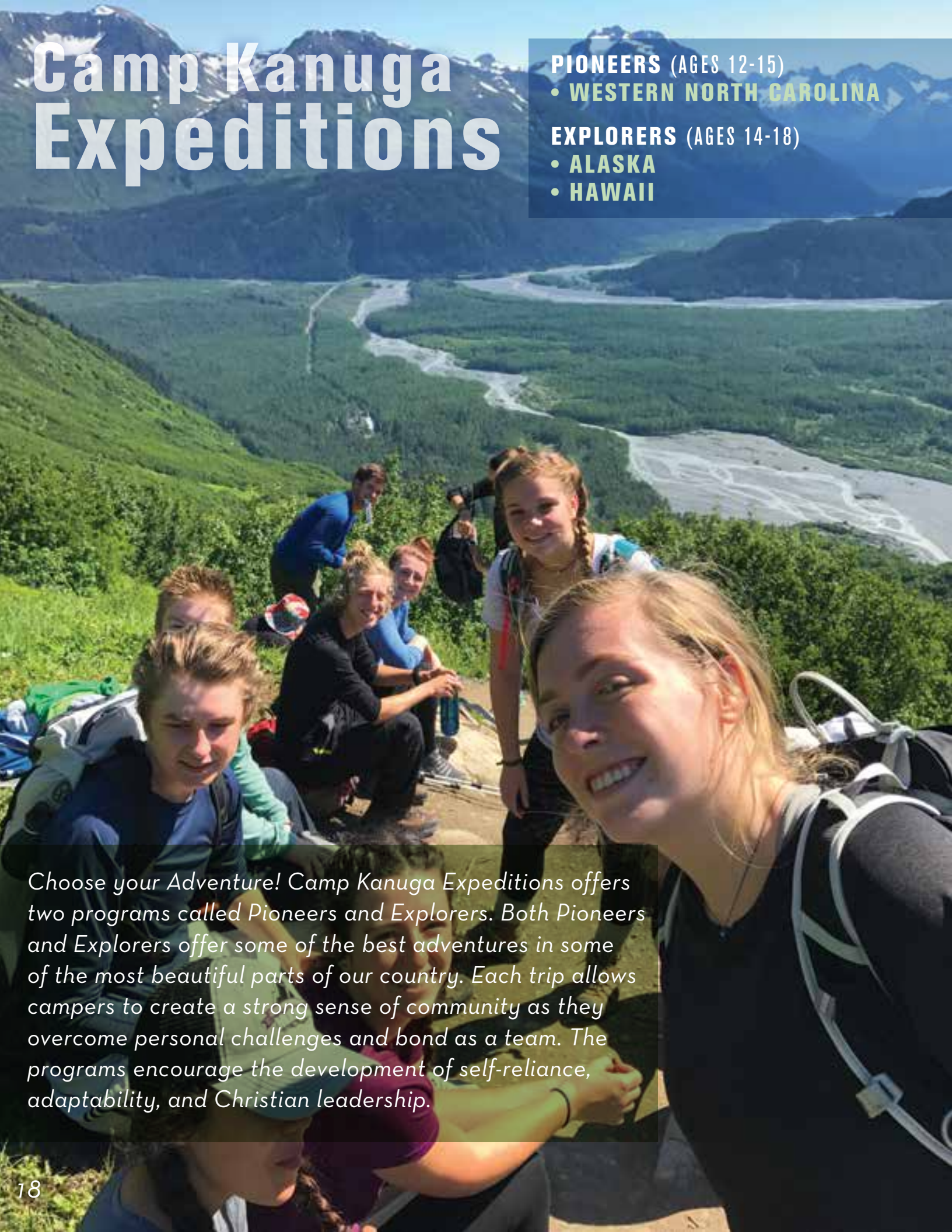

Pioneers

Pioneers Weeks

AGES 12-15 • DURATION: 6 DAYS • 12 STUDENTS/3 INSTRUCTORS AVG.

The Pioneers program is that first step into high adventure programming with six-day opportunities serving 12-15 year olds. Provide your child with their first taste of outdoor adventure! Our Pioneer Expedition emphasizes teamwork, self-reliance, adaptability, and leadership through a variety of day trips. Pioneers live on site at Camp Kanuga's Outpost, eat meals in the dining hall and participate in camp activities like Morning Jam and Evening Program. Each day Pioneers journey off site for a new adventure to return to join back in with the main camp.

- The **Canoeing and Climbing Expedition** includes learning basic, intermediate and advanced skills of canoes and rock climbing.
- The **Kayaking and Mountain Biking Expedition** includes learning basic, intermediate and advanced skills of kayaks and mountain bikes.

Kanuga's Leadership Academy is a ministry intent on forming the next generation of mentors. Designed for rising high school juniors and seniors, our three week program helps teens develop confidence and critical skills that are beneficial as they enter adulthood. These lifelong skills will assist them as they prepare for college, become a Camp Kanuga counselor, or tackle life goals.

LEADERSHIP TRAINING

The first week is comprised of leadership development and training, which includes an adventure weekend of camping, zip lining and tubing. During the final two weeks of academy, participants serve as camp counselors at a regional Camp Kanuga counselor, or tackle life goals.
